

# The Bulletin Following the Progress Board of FCC's Leaders

The following is a condensed version of the Board minutes. For the entire version, please see Office Administrator Virginia Ripple.

**Finance Reports:** Coby reported that FCC has a net equity of \$370,000, not including real estate or furniture and fixtures. He reported that line item per line item is good and that we're controlling expenses, but income is an issue. He also reported that Proctor & Associates shows that there will likely be a shortfall of \$6,000 to \$7,000 that will need to be transferred. He explained that we would likely only need to transfer that amount for October and November because December tends to be a good month of contributions.

Coby recommended, on Pastor Gina's information based on what she's seen in other churches, that we do not do pledges in 2026. Instead, he recommended presenting the expenditure plans to the congregation rather than presenting a negative budget. He pointed out that FCC still has plenty of assets and dollars and feels we should have faith that the finances will work out. Coby and Pastor Gina recommended presenting the proposed budget expenditures to the congregation with an emphasis that a lot of expenses have been cut and an understanding that needs and giving are fluid.

**Trustees Report:** Trustee Chair Linda Baker reported she, Trustee Deena Poynter and Finance Chair Coby Lamb had a meeting with Proctor & Associates. Proctor said in 2023 we had 189 contributors and by the end of 2024 we had 74.

#### **Team Reports:**

- **Property:** Property Co-chair Marcia Jordan reported that property had approved a supplemental agreement for property and equipment to the building use and fees, which the Board approved. Marcia also reported that she had talked to Liberty Gas and Evergy regarding the proposal that the church change their billing to an averaging billing status and found that we are eligible to do so. The Board approved the motion.
- Outreach/Evangelism: Pastor Gina reported that the Green Chalice planting went well with a good turnout of people. The Giving Tree is continuing to do well. Pastor Gina and Finance Chair Coby Lamb have been in discussion regarding the Outreach expenditures and the Caring & Sharing program. Pastor Gina reported that plans are being considered on Christmas outreach projects and that the team will be taking another look at where we are spending outreach funds and possibly making some changes.

#### **Minister's Report:**

Pastor Gina shared she has been checking with team leaders to see who is staying on for 2026 and what spots need to be filled. She asked for suggestions for people for leadership roles. She reminded everyone that our current situation is not the same as it used to be, so rather than stressing about trying to fill all the empty slots, it will be a case of "all hands on deck" with a core group mentality.

Pastor Gina shared that our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Show Down, Hoe Down, Chow Down will be scheduled for the middle of October. She added that this is a great opportunity not just to generate income, but also to get people in the building.

In November, Pastor Gina is planning to launch a second service called The Table, which will be a dinner

church in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesdays or Thursdays from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. She has already contacted Second Harvest of St. Joseph and other local businesses about providing food and recruited some volunteers. Funding has already been secured. She will share the full presentation with the congregation prior to the launch either the first or second week of November. She also made it clear that The Table is not it's own church, but rather a second service of FCC in a different format from Sunday morning.

Pastor Gina reported that she met with our Tech crew and other Team Chairs regarding the state of the Recreation Room and the need to make it a safer place for groups that meet in that room. She also reminded the Board that the Trustees gave permission in 2024 to post pictures of items on the marketplace for a low love offering or OBO. Anything remaining after that time will be thrown in the dumpster, as approved by Property.
