

Life doesn't exactly invite stillness. From the moment we wake up it begins, the world starts making noise. You don't even have to get out of bed before emails, schedules, notifications, and other tasks start to crowd your mind and your day. We live in a culture that glorifies busyness, convincing us that if we're not going full speed ahead, we're falling behind. And that's just the everyday noise, let's not forget about the broken record illusionary stories that are going on in our mind that we have bought into throughout our life. These can be some of the hardest to turn off.

On Sunday we invited you to press pause. Step away from the noise and step into the stillness. For some this is a foreign concept. People will even use expressions such as, "I'm too busy to take time to pause" or the gross phrase, "I will rest when I'm dead". That sounds ridiculous and is the exact reason why people are going through their days confused, overwhelmed, feeling run down, short tempered, easily getting ill...need I go on?

You see we need to pause. It's like the explanation of the Sabbath; it was made for us! Time to embrace the stillness, find clarity and get to know ourselves a little more. Can we create space for that stillness in our daily lives? It doesn't have to be complicated.

Maybe try...

- ⇔ Waking up five minutes earlier to sit in silence before the day begins.
- ⇔ Taking a slow, intentional breath before responding to a text or email.
- ⇔ Going for a walk without distractions. No music, no phone, just awareness and presence.
- R Turning off the car radio and letting God's presence fill the space.

These simple things can make a difference when practiced regularly. God is communicating with us all the time through many different ways. We just have to learn how to pause and listen. On Sunday, we take the next step of the journey. This is not about striving or trying to search harder. This is about tuning in to recognize the voice that is always present.
