"I didn't know that Disciples had missionaries" was a comment I heard when Elena Huegel visited in the past. Disciples support mission ministry request of churches and Christian organizations in other countries. Elena, who grew up in Central Mexico where Disciples in this area did short term mission work, answered the call to mission ministry in Paraguay, Chile and now in Chiapas, Mexico. She currently coordinates a program entitled Roots in the Ruins, Hope in Trauma, in both Chile and Chiapas and,

recently, Global Ministry's honored her family's 125 years of mission ministry.

Elena helped establish and coordinate the Shalom retreat and camping center in Chile and has published several books, as well as received the First Place prize in the 2018 Eastern Mennonite University's Center for Justice and Peace-building Alumni Storytelling Contest.

At the Institute for Intercultural Studies and Research, Elena works with diverse groups, helping them work in harmony to achieve common objectives, such as promoting justice and working towards peace. She says, "I am called to lift up and honor the dignity that we all share as God's creation and to participate in the healing of all our relationships."

On February 4 and 8, she will share stories of her ministry in Chiapas, including learning from the wisdom and beauty of the Mayan and the Mexican cultures and that countries can learn from each other. She will share stories of people from different cultures coming together, sharing their stories of trauma healing, resilience development, nourishing of dignity, grief process accompaniment and exploration of paths of justice. During her guest appearance, she will share the challenges and blessings of working in Chiapas.

A message from my heart to yours



What does faithfulness mean to you? I would imagine for some of us, the word brings up ideas of loyalty, devotion, commitment, consistency, promises, vows, etc. In my mind it always summons the presence of the late and great George Michael singing "Faith... you gotta have faith..." LOL. Okay but biblically speaking, faithfulness is about perseverance and steadiness. It's about locking in because you KNOW there is something greater than what's in front of you. There is promise, eternity, unending love and wholeness that was born in covenant with our God, Jehovah. It's that infinite understanding that no matter what the current moment looks like, good, bad, or indifferent; you still choose to remain anchored to God, even when the moment doesn't feel especially inspiring. Scripture says, "The Lord is faithful in all His words and gracious in all His deeds" (Psalm 145:13). Did you catch that? God's faithfulness isn't dependent on circumstances. It's simply who God is. We can show up in smaller, quieter ways such as continuing to care, choosing to take the higher road, and always embracing hope and perseverance when it would be easier to give in to emotional swings, numbness, or simply checking out. Paul encourages us with these words: "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up" (Galatians 6:9). Faithfulness isn't about seeing immediate results, it's about trusting that what has been planted will produce a harvest in its divine timing. So this week I invite you to sit with this...faithfulness doesn't mean doing more, it's about showing up with an open heart and staying true to who you are.

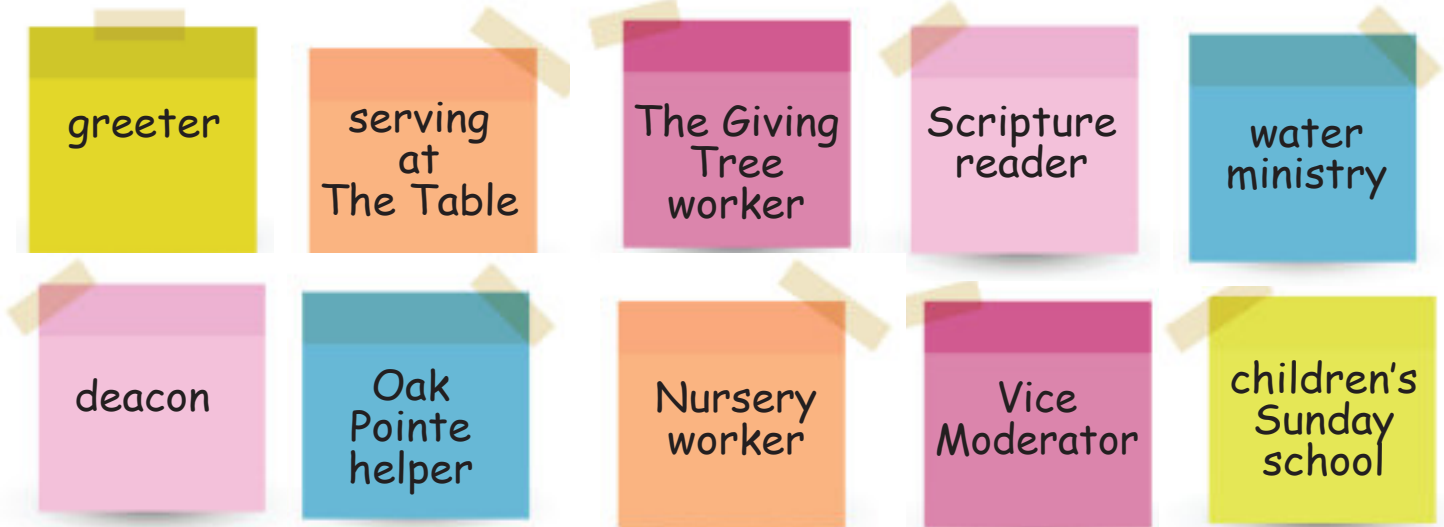

WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY



The cancellation of church should be considered if the temperature is 10 degrees or below OR if there is a significant amount of snow.

The Minister, Moderator, Head of Property, The Office Administrator, Church Technical Director should discuss and make this decision no later than 6:30 a.m. on the morning of service (or three hours before the event).

If the decision to cancel service is made:

1. The Office Administrator will send notification email and text to the congregation by 7:30 a.m. on the morning of service (or two hours before the event).
2. The Office Administrator will place notice on Facebook and FCC website by 7:30 a.m. on the morning of service.
3. Technical Director will work with the Minister to provide an online alternative service if both agree.
